## Analysis

**Flag 1: "energetic, ambitious professionals" / "high-energy culture"**

- **Risk:** Medium
- **Category:** Tone / Assumptions
- **Why it may be problematic:** Terms like "energetic" and "high-energy" can act as coded language that implies a preference for able-bodied or neurotypical individuals, potentially discouraging those with chronic fatigue, physical disabilities, or different cognitive processing styles.
- **Alternatives:**



1. "motivated, ambitious professionals" / "dynamic culture"
2. "We look forward to meeting candidates who share our commitment to excellence and professional growth."

**Flag 2: "ready to hit the ground running"**

- **Risk:** Low
- **Category:** Terminology
- **Why it may be problematic:** This idiom relies on a metaphor of physical running and emphasizes immediate, high-speed productivity, which can be a barrier for individuals who may require reasonable accommodations or a structured onboarding process.
- **Alternatives:**
  1. "ready to contribute from day one"
  2. "We're looking for candidates who are eager to start contributing to our team's success."

**Flag 3: "meet our hiring managers face-to-face and make a strong first impression"**

- **Risk:** Medium
- **Category:** Assumptions
- **Why it may be problematic:** It assumes that physical presence, visual interaction, and traditional social cues are the primary indicators of a candidate's potential, which may create barriers for persons with visual impairments, neurodivergent candidates, or those who require remote communication options.
- **Alternatives:**
  1. "connect with our hiring managers"
  2. "This is your opportunity to engage directly with our hiring managers and share your professional story."

**Flag 4: "Walk around and visit multiple department booths"**

- **Risk:** Medium
- **Category:** Assumptions
- **Why it may be problematic:** This phrasing assumes all candidates have the mobility to walk around a large ballroom, failing to acknowledge those who use mobility aids or have limited stamina.
- **Alternatives:**
  1. "Navigate the event space"



2. "Explore various department booths throughout the ballroom at your own pace."

**Flag 5: "Attend our 30-minute presentation... (standing room only)"**

- **Risk:** High
- **Category:** Ableism
- **Why it may be problematic:** Explicitly stating "standing room only" creates a direct physical barrier for anyone who cannot stand for 30 minutes due to physical disabilities, chronic pain, or pregnancy.
- **Alternatives:**
  1. "Seating and standing areas available"
  2. "Attend our 30-minute presentation; accessible seating will be provided for all who require it."

**Flag 6: "thrive under pressure and can keep pace with our industry-leading standards"**

- **Risk:** Medium
- **Category:** Assumptions / Deficit Framing
- **Why it may be problematic:** This language can signal a "high-intensity" culture that prioritizes speed and stress-tolerance, which may be unsupportive of neurodivergent individuals or those with episodic disabilities who may require flexible pacing.
- **Alternatives:**
  1. "effectively manage priorities"
  2. "We seek dedicated individuals who can effectively manage priorities and meet our industry-leading standards in a collaborative environment."

**Flag 7: "hotel has several flights of stairs from the parking garage"**

- **Risk:** High
- **Category:** Erasure
- **Why it may be problematic:** Highlighting stairs as the primary route without mentioning elevators or accessible paths creates a physical and psychological barrier for people with mobility disabilities.
- **Alternatives:**
  1. "Elevators are available from the parking garage"
  2. "The hotel is fully accessible via elevators from the parking garage; please follow the signs for the Ballroom Level."

**Flag 8: "be prepared to stand for extended periods"**



- **Risk:** High
- **Category:** Ableism
- **Why it may be problematic:** This sets a physical requirement for a career fair that may not be a "bona fide" requirement for the actual job, directly discriminating against people who use wheelchairs or have other mobility impairments.
- **Alternatives:**
  1. "Seating will be provided throughout the event"
  2. "We encourage you to dress professionally and comfortably; seating and rest areas will be available throughout the event space."

#### **Flag 9: "rapid-fire conversations"**

- **Risk:** Medium
- **Category:** Neurodiversity / Assumptions
- **Why it may be problematic:** "Rapid-fire" implies a speed of communication that can be intimidating and exclusionary for neurodivergent candidates or those with speech or hearing disabilities who may need more time to process or respond.
- **Alternatives:**
  1. "engaging conversations"
  2. "Be ready to discuss your skills and experiences in engaging, one-on-one conversations with our team."

## Justification

I have reviewed the feedback from the General Framing Analyst, the NCDJ Style Guide Advisor, the Canadian Disability Communication Guide Advisor, and the APA Inclusive Language Guide Advisor.

The overall approach was to remove physical barriers and deficit framing while maintaining the professional and enthusiastic tone of the original posting.

Key changes by category:

- **Ableism / Erasure:** Removed explicit requirements to stand ("standing room only", "stand for extended periods") and walk ("Walk around"), replacing them with inclusive alternatives that highlight accessible seating and navigation. Added information about elevator access instead of just mentioning stairs.
- **Tone / Assumptions:** Replaced coded language like "energetic" and "high-energy" with "motivated" and "dynamic" to avoid implying a preference for able-bodied or neurotypical individuals.



- **Neurodiversity / Assumptions:** Softened language around "rapid-fire conversations" and "thrive under pressure" to "engaging conversations" and "effectively manage priorities" to be more welcoming to neurodivergent candidates and those with different communication styles.
- **Terminology:** Replaced the physical idiom "hit the ground running" with "contribute from day one".

## Notes:

Where agents disagreed on risk tiers (e.g., "energetic" was rated Medium by the Framing Analyst but Low by others), I defaulted to the higher risk tier (Medium) to ensure maximum inclusivity and noted the rationale in the analysis.
